Haiti Ministry Mission Team Arrives Home

We give thanks to God for his faithfulness and mercy! The Haiti Ministry Team, including our own Susan Meeder, arrived home safely, had calm travel situations, and were able to see God at work in resolving issues and providing resources for St. Jean Baptiste School. Prayers are needed for Bertrand, the St. Jean Baptiste School headmaster, who was injured in a motorbike accident. We don't know how long he will have a cast, but we pray for continued healing and excellent care, no complications and full mobility in his leg.

Also, during the trip, it was discovered that the school had no source of water onsite, complicating the cooking of rice and beans each school day for 517 students besides not having water to drink or wash the many fingers and hands! We are now exploring the feasibility of accessing water on the school property whether it is to drill a new well or deepen the SJB well that went dry. Please pray for community relationships throughout this process, as well as success in finding an affordable solution for water.



Update from the Starwalts

Coleen and Ervin Starwalt are Wycliffe missionaries and friends of TAC. In their March Prayer Letter, Coleen asks that we remember her and her work partner, Steve, in prayer that their linguistics work will ultimately help the Dadiya translators to translate better and also

This Good News is what motivates us to persevere in our work to see God's written word accurately interpreted, translated and applied to people's lives so they can become more like Jesus! Austin Street Center Ministry News

There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore I command you to be openhanded toward your brothers and toward the poor and needy in your land. Deut. 15:17

Wednesday, May 29 is the date of our next visit to the Austin Street Center on Hickory St. in downtown Dallas. For those of you who are new to our congregation and wonder what this ministry is, perhaps this will help you understand. If a month has 5 **Wednesdays** in it (about 4 times a year) we at **Transformation** make and take food down to feed the homeless clients, usually 400 + each time. We meet in the parish hall of the church about 3:00 in the afternoon. It is simple fare such as sandwiches, meats and breads purchased by donations; boiled eggs you can bring to the church with the shells still on; cupcakes/cookies which you bake at home; and then we also purchase dill pickle slices, potato chips, juice, and fruit plus milk which is donated by Tom

Thumb. So you can see that we need volunteers to manage all of this, especially those who like to bake cupcake and cookies, and boil eggs. We also need donations to help purchase all of this, especially if you don't have the time to bake or boil but want to participate. If you would like to help, you can make your check out to TAC with a note it is for ASC and give it to us so that you get credit on your Giving Statement. Or just hand your cash donations, large or small, to Sharon Parker or Susan Maupin. We appreciate all help. Then about 5:15, we load up our cars and head to Austin Street. Drivers and servers are always needed to assist. Especially drivers, as some of us do not like to drive at night. We start serving about 6:00 and are generally finished by 7 or so and go home. If you have never been to a shelter to help serve, you will find that it is a joy to meet and feed the clients there. Talk to Sue Griffin, Susan Maupin, Larry Maupin or Sharon Parker for more info.

The following article was taken from The Austin Street Newsletter:

We Are Hopefuls, Not Homeless. This is what some of the clients of Austin Street Center say about themselves. The goal is not to stay at the Center, but to get help and training to go out into society and work to have a home and a car. While there are a few who don't want a new life, most do. The new face of homelessness can be doctors, lawyers, teachers and other professionals and we should realize that we could all be one paycheck away from becoming homeless. How do these clients get to Austin Street? What problems bring them there?

One woman, named Donna, has been there since 2012. She had taken care of her sick mother for 12 years, giving up her job to do so. When her mother died, Donna had no place to go and no income, and became so depressed she wanted to kill herself. Instead she found her way to Austin Street where she received the help she needed to get into a program that would provide some funds for her.

A man lost his wife 6 ½ years ago and because he had taken care of her full time, he lost his home to foreclosure. His wife had been a teacher in the schools in Dallas, but there were no funds to help much after she passed away. He became a client of Austin Street and is trying to work his way out and back into the society from which he came.

Another man lost his teenage son after the son left the house to go to the store for his mom and dad. Fifteen minutes after he left they received a call from the police that he had been killed. This took such a toll on him and his wife that they separated, he became depressed and started drinking; lost his job and also ended up at the shelter. There are many reasons and each client has a different story. Some have been clients for years, especially those who have some sort of mental illness, but others came only a few weeks or months ago.

If you are involved in any way with ASC you know that faith is encouraged. There are several Bible Studies for them to attend during the week in addition to the choir that sings not only in the **chapel** during a service, but also goes to nursing homes to entertain the residents there. **The Pathway House**, a part of Austin Street, is directly across the street and is a place for a selected few to have more privacy and beds. These people are being trained so that they can find jobs and support themselves.

Case workers assist the clients to get the help they need from the government, such as Social Security, Disability, and medical help. So you see, there is hope and there is help for the homeless in Dallas.
