

Time Change: Please remember that the **time will change** at 2:00 a.m. Sunday, November 5th, **falling back one hour** to Central Standard Time.


All Saints' Sunday: This **holy day** falls on **November 1st**, but we will **celebrate All Saints' Sunday on the 5th**. This day allows us to **honor all the saints, known and unknown**.



The Collect reads: “Almighty God, you have knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord: Give us grace so to follow your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those ineffable joys that you have prepared for those who truly love you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. **Amen.**”

International Day of Prayer: November 5th is also designated as the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. This year, Voice of the Martyrs reminds us that as we pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters, we must also remember Jesus' call to pray for the persecutors as we “bless those who curse you”.

First Sunday Celebration: Following the worship service, we will gather in the cafeteria for our **First Sunday Celebration** which includes a covered dish lunch and fellowship.



New Adult Christian Education

Starting on November 5th at 9:30 a.m., we will begin a new adult offering. Austin Street Center Ministry News

Coming up at the end of November is the 5th Wednesday of the month and you know what that means...Austin Street Center!!! Yes, we will be gathering to make about 800 sandwiches of different varieties – tuna salad, chicken salad, ham salad, turkey and ham, plus peanut butter and jelly – and bag the boiled eggs you all provide. During this time, we fellowship and serve the Lord by going down to feed approximately 400 clients of ASC. This all happens on **November 29, starting about 3:00 at the home of Larry and Susan Maupin in Dallas at 8930 Covey Court**. We invite you to join with us as we prepare. Then, go with us to the Center on Hickory Street in Dallas. We leave the Maupin's house about 5:30 and drive downtown. After feeding the folks, we are usually home before 8:00. So you can see, it is a busy Wednesday, but not to terribly long. The rewards are great, knowing you are feeding someone who is hungry,

and providing the love of Jesus to them is a wonderful feeling. All of the clients are thankful to receive this food and contact with someone outside the center.

In order to provide this meal, we will need about 36 dozen cupcakes/pkg. of cookies from our wonderful bakers. We will also need 36 dozen boiled eggs (shells left on, please). Needed monies may also be donated which help to purchase potato chips, pickles, juice, and milk in addition to plates, napkins, and cups. Please consider joining with us for this ministry. The OSL Corner

The Order of St. Luke the Physician is an inter-denominational, international ministry for healing of body, mind and spirit.

His father was sick in bed, suffering from fever and dysentery. Paul went in to see him and, after prayer, placed his hand on him and healed him. Acts 28:8

Is anyone of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. James 5:14

I don't know if you have really noticed it or not, but it seems like a number of people in our congregation have become ill or have received an injury and this has been going on since before we started building the church. The building has been delayed at different times for reasons that don't seem to make sense to most of us, but we can be sure our enemy has something to do with it. Therefore, I purpose that we all use a prayer similar to the one below to pray for our families and the church. Remember to plead the blessed blood of Jesus over yourself and your family each morning, and then thank the Lord at the end of the day for His protection.

“Lord, nothing is impossible with You. Nothing is too difficult for You. Nothing can hinder You. (Luke 1:37; Jeremiah 32:27; 1 Samuel 14:6) You can heal every kind of sickness, disease, infirmity, and pain. And You have promised to be our Healer. (Exodus 15:26) Therefore, we ask that right now You cause Your healing power to flow mightily throughout every part of our bodies, throughout every fiber of our being, so that our health and healing will spring forth speedily at a supernatural rate. (Isaiah 58:8)

Satan, in the name and authority of the Lord Jesus Christ, we bind you and all the forces of evil, and we make you powerless to operate against us in any way. Sickness, disease, infirmity, and pain, we command you to loose us and let us go free, in Jesus' name. (Matthew 18:18) We command every organ, tissue, and cell of our bodies to come into line with the Word of God, and with the finished work of Christ on the Cross, and be healed and made whole, in Jesus' name. (Isaiah 53:5; John 19:30) AMEN.

We declare that the same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead lives in us, and gives life and health to our mortal bodies, every moment of every day. (Romans 8:11) We claim the abundant life that Jesus died to give us. Thank You, Lord, for giving us power and authority over every disease and sickness, in Jesus' name! (Matthew 10:1)

As members of the Order of St. Luke, we understand the importance of prayer and the faith we need to believe that our prayers will be answered. When we declare our belief in Jesus and accept Him as our Savior, we are all given a measure of faith, and it is enough to pray and believe for healing and protection. In the Order of St. Luke, we are taught to accept this faith and to lean on Jesus for answers to our prayers.
